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## MINUTES of a MEETING of OPC RECREATION & ENVIRONMENT COMMITTEE

3. Minutes - The Minutes of the previous meeting held on 27 June 2016 were signed as an accurate record of the meeting.

4. Matters arising from the previous meeting not covered elsewhere on the agenda.

It was agreed that the Clerk will ask SDC for a quote to put in a new dog poo bin on the 50/16 BT а footpath running between Bubblestone Road and the Church close to the noticeboard. Continuing A quote will also be sought for a litterbin to be installed near the Eric Dilley Pavilion.

Scout Hut Fence. Some of the fence has been painted outside the Scout Hut. The Clerk b will ask the Scouts if they would be prepared to paint the remainder of the fence to make it blend into the area. The Parish Council will be willing to help with the cost of the paint.

- A written report was received from the Otford Sports Association. Minutes of the OSA Meeting held on 26 July 2016 have also been received. In response to the minute from the OSA, Cllr Nick Rushby noted that David Hobson's recollection of the negotiations was faulty. Fortunately, he and Cllr Jon Verrall had kept careful records, an email trail, and ensured that at least two Councillors were present at key meetings.

Having been asked by F&GP to look into the matter of the lease, OUFC was first approached in February 2016, long before F&GP started talking to OUJFC. It was David Hobson himself who in February suggested May as the date to agree the new lease. Repeated emails from April referred to a May deadline. Otford Parish Council was keen to resolve the matter and Cllrs Rushby and Verrall were asked to complete it by mid-May.

The original lease from 2006 gave OUFC the use of the Pavilion rent free for a period of 10 years in recognition of their help in obtaining the grant from the FA and other investments. This is confirmed in the Council minutes, other documents and conversations with Doug Cracknell. OUFC was the preferred candidate to become the lessee and it was only when emails from David Hobson in early May indicated that the Club would be unwilling to take up the lease, that serious negotiations with OUJFC were started.

Cllr Rushby was also asked by the Chairman of OPC to investigate other potential lessees (eg Sevenoaks Rugby) in case OUJFC were unable to take up the lease. Although Sevenoaks Rugby were enthusiastic and offered to pay a significant rent to OPC, at no time were they offered the lease.

OUFC were given a draft copy of the lease at a meeting on 14 April (at which Cllr Verrall and Cllr Rushby were present) and said that they would get a solicitor to look at it. However, the Committee was very busy and were unable to find the time to discuss it for several weeks. This, together with delaying emails from David Hobson and the understanding of the precarious financial position of the Club, indicated that OUFC was probably unable to take on the lease. Given the OUFC's finances, entering into a lease would have posed a serious risk to both the Club and OPC.

David Hobson contacted the Parish Clerk and demanded several sets of keys. The Clerk told him that it had been agreed by F&GP that, as is customary, the lessee (OUJFC) should be responsible for the keys and should issue them at their discretion.

There is a fundamental problem here that OUFC, having procrastinated at length about negotiating the lease (for which they were the preferred lessee), cannot accept that OPC has signed a lease with OUJFC and that they have to talk to OUJFC about use of the Pavilion, keys etc. Councillors have repeatedly reminded OUFC of this over the past two months.

The statement that OPC has no regard for football on the Recreation Ground is clearly absurd. The Council used its best endeavours to negotiate a lease with OUFC and focused on working with an Otford-based football club. David Hobson is aware of the investment made by the Council in replacing the doors to the tractor garage, the plans to improve the air handling in the Eric Dilley Pavilion, and the plans to improve the drainage on the floodlit pitch.

Cllr Rushby noted that he had come sympathy with the plight of the Club Committee. As David Hobson notes, they have served the Club for over 30 years. It appears that the Club is in a difficult financial situation and should, under the OSA Constitution (5(e), have reported this to the OSA Committee. OPC has been very sympathetic to OUFC's difficulty in paying the recharges for 2015-16. It has accepted a part payment (approximately 50% of the amount) and deferred payment of the balance until December 2016. It is now being discussed whether part of this amount can be offset against the purchase of the garage and other equipment installed by OUFC in the Pavilion.

There are some lessons to be learned from this experience and can be applied to future matters such as the renewal of the lease on the Hale Lane facilities.

Members will recall that the matter of the Eric Dilley Pavilion Lease was initially discussed by the Recreation Committee and was then transferred to F&GP. While this was the appropriate course of action, it broke an important formal link to the OSA. Although Kay Drake was kept in touch with progress, there was no formal reporting mechanism and so the OSA felt that they were kept out of the loop.

Secondly, Council should be more open about the leasing process and who it is talking to. It is suggested that when the lease on Hale Lane comes up for renewal in 2017, the Council

could publish a document describing the process it intends to follow, and ensure the

expressions of interest for the lease are invited from all potential lessees. Council to consider Cllr Roy suggested that formal documents and communications (for example the lease, requests for information and expressions of interest) should be issued by the Clerk. It is RECOMMENDED that the renewal of the lease for facilities at Hale Lane should be handled by F&GP. 7. Community Warden Paul 54/16 PR а Robertson will be asked to inform the owners that they should not block access to the area. Completed Mr Thomas has reported that the fence on the right hand side is leaning over the path and b 57/16 BT is in a bad state of decay. This needs to be scheduled for replacement. Continuing There appears to be a fault with one of the new pieces of play equipment. Sutcliffes will be 73/16 BT С attending to inspect this. The new hedge is scheduled for a trim. A contractor with a tractor mounted flail will be d 74/16 BT required to cut the top. Mr Thomas will schedule this work for the autumn. Two posts supporting the earth bank have rotted. Sutcliffes will be asked to inspect these е 75/16 BT at the same time they inspect the faulty play equipment. f The ash trees will be inspected at Telston Park later in September by Tree Ability. 76/16 BT 10. Oxenhill Wood There is a very muddy area at the top end near the entrance to Kemsing Recreation 56/16 а Ground. It will be very expensive to improve this area and would require a membrane and a Continuing considerable amount of road stone. A similar problem in the lower south-western corner needs the same treatment. SDC is looking at a number of grant opportunities to cover the cost of this work. Kent County Councillor Nick Chard is being approached regarding a contribution from his Members Fund. Cllr Evans has asked Mr Froud if the paths can be cut as soon as the area dries out. b A meeting of the Oxenhill Shaw Management Committee will take place on Wednesday 21 C September (including a site visit). The bund is very overgrown. SDC has been asked to clear it but they have reported d problems with access to this area. A large hole has appeared on the track leading to the area. 11. Village Green, Pond and Palace Field Simon's bench has now been installed. Completed а Reeds have been thinned from the pond. More will be removed shortly. 77/16 BT h
