Citizens Advice Bureau

If you are tempted by offers of a 'free holiday' or a chance to join a 'holiday club' be very careful, as the old 'timeshare scam' seems to be back, under a slightly different guise. Citizens Advice Bureaux nationally have seen an increase in complaints from people who have bought 'holiday club' membership at high-pressure sales presentations, often after winning a 'free' holiday. The holiday turns out not to be free and is poor value and inflexible. Problems in the timeshare and holiday club market are not new. Trading standards

departments in the UK had over 4,400 complaints in 2002 alone. At Sevenoaks CAB they have seen an increase in people who have been pressurised into joining holiday clubs, often after winning a 'free' holiday, which requires them to attend a presentation. At presentations people are bombarded with facts and figures, and pushed into signing a contract. They are also persuaded to pay a deposit on the spot, which they can't get back once they have had time to consider the deal. At present there is no legal protection for consumers ripped off in this way. The Timeshare Act 1992, addresses some of the problems by tackling pressure selling, lack of accurate information and difficulty in getting deposits back. But some rogue traders are back with similar scams, avoiding the legislation by not selling timeshare, but selling a slightly different product through 'holiday clubs'. To combat pressure selling, the Timeshare Act give consumers a cooling off period and made it a requirement for timeshare companies to provide information about the contract; it also banned taking deposits from consumers when they first signed up. The new 'holiday clubs' escape the definition of timeshare by not applying to fixed accommodation – they are either on boats or in a range of different locations. They also bypass the protection given to consumers by limiting the holiday club packages to under 3 years. The EU and the UK government have acknowledged the problem and are planning new legislation to crack down on the problem. But until this comes into force, consumers should be very wary about these holiday clubs.

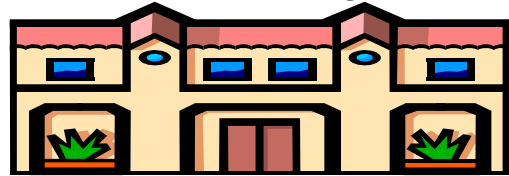
