Sevenoaks Library, Museum & Art Gallery



Sevenoaks Library will shortly be undergoing an exciting period of redevelopment to provide 'the Kaleidoscope' an innovative approach to integrated service provision. Principally paid for by the Heritage Lottery Fund, the project is also supported by KCC, SDC and Sevenoaks Town Council. £995,000 Lottery Funding will remodel the building to provide improved access to heritage, arts, knowledge and ideas through high quality facilities and KCC is planning to invest an additional £50,000 in bookstock over the next two years. Inevitably, the building works associated with such an exciting and ambitious capital project will result in some temporary impact on the level of service. The existing building will close August 2005 and reopen at the end of May 2006. They are still looking for alternative temporary accommodation in town but suitable property is scarce so the following arrangements will probably take place.

- Transfer of the children's library and family-centred services to the adjacent leisure centre.
- Siting a mobile library in the library car park to provide adult lending services.
- Extending the opening hours at Kemsing, Otford, Riverhead and Seal libraries to 6 days per week including late night and Saturday opening.

- Providing access to copies of the Sevenoaks archive collection at Seal library
- Providing Business Information services at Kemsing and Seal.

As more detailed information becomes available we will publish it in subsequent newsletters.

you are not sure of the location please ring the Secretary. We must have numbers for this a week in advance so please let the Secretary know if you are coming on 01732 761359

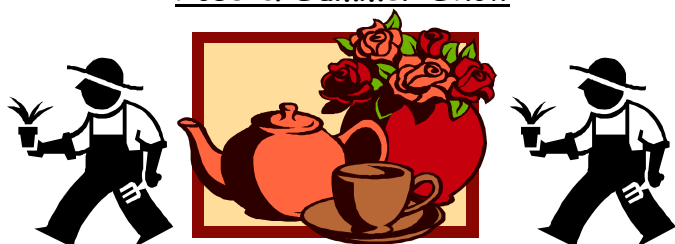
Sevenoaks Embroiderers' Guild

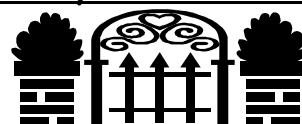

St Bartholomew's - Secret Gardens and Teddy Aerial Runway



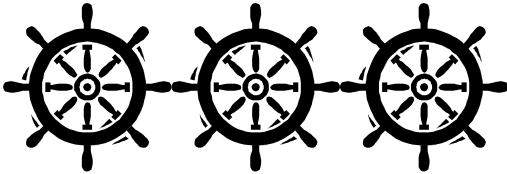

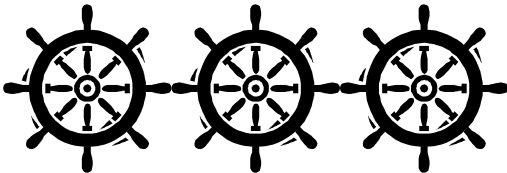
Otford & District Historical Society Summer Outings

Dog Fouling

Despite many pleas to dog walkers to clear up their pet's deposits on our public recreation grounds in the centre of the village and Hale Lane, and also footways, it is becoming an even greater problem - and a serious health hazard. Of course, failure to clear up is an offence.

Always take a plastic bag with you when you go for a walk and use it please. Bags can be put in ordinary waste bins but there are now dog bins on the Recreation Ground, Hale Lane and Telston Park (Plastic carrier bags are available from the parish office when open) Remember that under the Dogs

(Fouling of Land) Act 1996 the law says that all dog owners **must** clean up after their dog fouls in a public place. If you don't you risk having to pay a fine of up to a maximum of £1,000 or a fixed penalty of £25. Dog wardens do patrol the area and every effort will be taken to discover who is responsible and when caught, fined.

Litter Picking

Please do not drop litter in this your village, there is no need to do so as rubbish bins are provided at a number of locations. If all residents would please pick up a piece of litter as you walk around the village it would help keep our village as lovely as it should be as befits our title of Village of The Year for Kent and South and South East England 2002.
